Investment Objective

Seeks long-term capital appreciation through investment in an actively managed portfolio of equity and equity-related securities issued by large, mid and small capitalisation companies in developed countries.

Investment Approach

- The Fund invests in a broad set of equity and equity-related securities across all market capitalisations in developed countries and seeks to increase expected returns by overweighting securities the Investment Manager believe to be trading at lower valuations and with higher profitability ratios.
- The Investment Manager pursues the benefits associated with indexing (diversification, low turnover, transparency of exposures), but with the ability to add value by making investment decisions using information in current prices.
- The Fund's efficient portfolio management and trading process are designed to reduce unnecessary risks and costs while seeking to enhance returns.
